The State of Missouri to the Constable of Ste. Genevieve Township in Ste. Genevieve County.

Greetings

You are hereby commanded to summon Jacob Yeally to be and appear before Mr. James Simms one of the Justices of the Peace in and for [foresaid] County, at my office forthwith there and then to [\_\_\_\_\_] testimony, and the truth to say [touching] a certain complaint made in behalf of the State against Francis [Cromer] for throwing of rocks at the dwelling house and [assaulting?, of visiting] one Pelagie Vital in the County of Ste. Genevieve and State of Missouri on the night of the 10<sup>th</sup> February 1840, as aforesaid and hereof fail not at your [peril] under the penalty of the law. [Given] under my hand I seal this the 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 1840.
