

The State of Missouri to any Constable of the County of Ste. Genevieve, Greeting:

Thomas Pelagie alias Pelagie Vital, a free woman of color, on the 20th day of May 1848, had given information upon oath, to me Joseph D. Grafton, a Justice of the Peace and for the County of Ste. Genevieve, that on the 12th day of May 1848, in a public street near the residence of J. Sargeant to wit, in the Town of Ste. Genevieve in the County of Ste. Genevieve & State aforesaid, Henry Badreau, a free man of color did then and there meet her, and did then and there, by force and menace, prevent her from peaceably passing in said in said street, by force and strong hand, to wit, by shaking & presenting his fist towards her, in striking posture, inasmuch, that in order to prevent him from striking her she had to seek shelter under the porch or gallery of J. Sargeant, at the same time the said Badreau, using violent language, such as "Sacri Gaver" &c, and also at the same time telling her that if he met her & she repeated what she had said to him, he would beat her, & further, that she has reason to believe and does believe that said Henry Badreau did intend and does now intend to do her some personal injury:-

There are therefore to command you forthwith to apprehend the said Henry Badreau & bring him before me to answer the premises & further to be dealt with according to law..
